

From the Clergy

ROGATION SUNDAY - WHAT'S THE POINT?

The word rogation comes from the Latin *rogare* meaning to ask. Rogation Sunday is the Sunday before Ascension Day – when Christians celebrate Christ's Ascension to heaven - and Ascension Day is 40 days after Easter. This year it is on Sunday May 25th although for practical reasons it may be celebrated on different Sundays – the Deanery Rogation Reflective Ramble is at Hardwicke on 11th May.

The custom began in the 5th century when St Mamertus, the Bishop of Vienne in France, wrote prayers to be used in processions to ask for good weather for the crops and deliverance from pestilence, famine and earthquakes. In his case troublesome pests included wolves!

The English church appropriated the festival so that on Rogation Sunday the vicar would lead a procession of churchwardens, choirboys and parishioners 'beating the bounds' of the parish asking for God's blessing on the crops including rain and sun at the desired times and consequently on the well-being of the parish.

George Herbert, the 17th century poet priest, wrote about the excitement surrounding the Rogation Day procession. He describes his congregation as 'addicted to these processions in the fields'. Ever practical he wrote 'to favour Rogation processions is to win their hearts, and to oppose them is to deject them'.

Herbert continued the custom in his rural parish near Salisbury for a number of other reasons 'to seek God's blessing for the fields to bear fruit; to seek the preservation of justice in the boundaries of the parish; so that his parishioners might walk in love with one another and reconcile differences; and to practice mercy and generosity towards the poor from God's provisions'.

These practical aims are just as important now. During a Rogation walk we ask for God's blessing on a particular place, for the community and for their common good. It is inclusive, everyone is invited, there is time to chat and to get to know people. The walk is tailored to the needs and circumstances of the people and very often finishes with refreshments!

CHILDREN'S PLAYPARK, MICHAELCHURCH SPORTS PAVILION

Over the last year committee members have been researching kid's play equipment and clearing an area at the pavilion for a future Children's Playpark.

There will be a display and information about this exciting new venture at the first Michaelchurch Summer Social on Friday the 9th May 5pm 'til late (please note the new earlier kids friendly start time). There will be the usual BBQ and bar so do come along for the first Summer Social 2025.

And to start the ball rolling (questionable pun intended) Matthew Engel's recent Bridge Quiz Night raised the amazing sum of £970 for the Playpark Project. A brilliant start for fundraising for this community project. As many of you know Matthew's quizzes, always fun, quirky and not too challenging, have raised money for a variety of charities over the years and the Playpark Team would like to thank Matthew and team and all the quizzers who attended on the night for their generosity.

ST MARY'S CHURCH CRASWALL - A WORK IN PROGRESS...

Following our Quinquennial Review (a five yearly report on the condition of the church building) last autumn, a number of areas of concern were highlighted. The most urgent is the state of the roof. Even with the dedicated care and attention of Ken Watkins, church warden emeritus, given to regularly replacing/refixing missing and slipped tiles over many years the time has come to grasp the nettle, so to speak.

With help and guidance from our architect, Deborah Johnson, we've engaged a builder, structural surveyor and ecologist to start the preliminary steps towards reroofing the church. We have been successful in obtaining funding for the initial "holding repairs", structural survey and bat roosting survey from the Hereford Diocese Buildings for Mission Small Repairs and Improvement Grant fund. This funding will lay the groundwork for future design decisions and the repairs will help keep the wet out while we pursue further funding for the project. Although the PCC have completed several smaller improvements in the last few years including the complete rewiring of the church, new guttering and downpipes and netting the undereaves to exclude nesting jackdaws this will be a big project involving planning consent, a church faculty (basically C of E planning consent) and some serious grant applications for funding for the whole project. Undaunted ...we look forward to securing the future of this much-loved place of worship.

MICHAELCHURCH ESCLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL

After what felt like the longest and wettest winter ever, March has rewarded us with some truly wonderful weather which has continued into April. When the sun is shining, the hills, fields and woodland around our little school and preschool are even more lovely than ever and we have all been appreciating the specialness of our surroundings this past month or so.

2025 continues to be a very busy time at Michaelchurch Escley Primary and Pre-School with a huge variety of activities and events taking place. Sapling and Acorn Classes both really enjoyed their online ballet workshops with the Royal Ballet School. The children practised the art of storytelling through movement and tried out a few plies and jetes too! They also learnt a little about the Royal Ballet School and the ballets they perform.

Learning outside the classroom, a particular passion of ours at Michaelchurch, does not just mean heading out on trips. It also involves working with visiting artists, for example, which takes the children out of their normal classroom environment and routines. Recently we welcomed Martin Jennings of Architecture Workshops to our school to conduct an architecture workshop with the children in Acorn, Sapling and Oak Classes. Working together, the children built some amazing structures of vast proportions, using nothing more than sticks and elastic bands. The children learnt about the strength of different shapes, especially triangles, when linked together. They had a brilliant time and learnt a great deal too, in multiple areas of the curriculum.

It is not just the children who have been learning at Michaelchurch either. We were delighted to invite our school community into school as part of our Fuelling Futures healthy eating campaign. A range of nutrition experts, including the school nurse, and our own lunchtime chef Verity, were on hand in the hall to discuss healthy meals and especially healthy lunch boxes. In addition, the children and staff made some wonderful healthy meals and snacks to share with the parents. It can be really tricky to get children

to eat healthy meals, especially in their school lunch boxes and we hope that events such as this can help in some way to provide easy, healthy ideas for children's lunches.

Being right in the middle of sheep farming country, ewes and lambs are common sites around school but it is not often we have a lamb actually in school! However, Miss Cook gave the children a treat when she brought a 'pet' lamb she had been feeding into school. Nothing melts hearts quicker than a new lamb and within seconds, the whole school was queuing up for a cuddle (or at least a stroke or two!).

Our pre-school children have been especially busy this term. They popped out to visit Dulas Court Care Home where they were both entertained and were entertainers. They had a lovely time meeting some of the residents and staff of Dulas Court and hopefully brightened up a few people's days too. Pre-school also had a trip out to the Small Breeds Farm near Kington, where they thoroughly enjoyed getting handson with the wonderful rare and small breed animals in perfect late spring weather.

Coming up we have an action-packed summer term ahead with so much going on! There are residentials, Oak activity week, Bay to Hay (bike ride), the Hay Festival and our summer production of *Oliver* to name just a few!

With rural crime ever present, the police would encourage landowners and homeowners to use SmartWater technology to mark their valuables. SmartWater forensic marking technology is used to combat crime by providing a unique, invisible liquid that glows under UV light, allowing for the stolen property to be traced. This technology can be applied to assets, individuals, and even intruders, providing a strong forensic link to a crime. SmartWater is particularly effective in deterring theft and violence. It is available to purchase at many places online. The Police will offer free property markings but this will leave a visible marking on your valuables where SmartWater cannot been seen with the naked eye.

RUN Hereford moves 2025 edition into the city

"We're so excited to be bringing RUN Hereford into the city," said Amy Johnson, Events and Community Fundraiser at St Michael's.

"We hope as many people as possible will sign up to take part in the event. Or, if they're not running, it would be great to see the people of Herefordshire line the streets to cheer them on."

Events and Free Exhibition at Leominster Priory 14 June – 14 July 2025 Celebrating 900 years of Leominster Priory 1125 – 2025

In 2025 the Norman Nave of Leominster Priory will be 900 years old. It is a nationally important spiritual, cultural and community space, and this significant birthday will be marked by a monthlong festival celebrating the Priory's amazing story.

It's a royal story of tragedy and triumph wrought in stone. In the wake of the tragic drowning of his son, the Norman King Henry I secured his legacy by the building of Leominster Priory and Reading Abbey. Using the full resources of the English Crown, Henry commissioned the majestic Norman Nave, decorated with elaborate carvings by stone masons representing the famous Herefordshire School of Romanesque Sculpture. The focus of Priory 900 will be the architectural heritage of this early medieval period, explored through exhibitions, craft demonstrations, interactive workshops, talks, walks, book launches, concerts, dramas, and church services. Visitors will discover the history of Norman Leominster and the stories of some of the characters associated with the Priory. They include the last Saxon Abbess of Leominster, Eadgifu, who may have been one of just three women depicted in the Bayeux Tapestry. She was abducted from Leominster by Swein Godwinson, a potential heir to the English throne, and their son Hakon was a hostage at Duke William of Normandy's court in the years before the Battle of Hastings – linking Leominster to '1066 and all that'! During the festival, eight actual-size replica scenes from the Bayeux tapestry will be displayed in the Norman Nave. This will be an opportunity to see how the tapestry was originally displayed and used. Replica artefacts will bring images in the tapestries to life.

Leominster-based Stitched Atlas Folk are embroidering a diptych responding to this history, in collaboration with Rose Tinted Rags who will create a third artwork linking the two. Students from Hereford College of Arts and the University of Worcester are also creating works for the exhibition, and the Priory 900 programme includes opportunities for schoolchildren, community groups and the general public to visit the Priory and learn about its history, including an illustrated timeline, and a new film about the Priory as a place of pilgrimage and its Lost East End.

Priory 900 is also a celebration for the villages surrounding Leominster, part of the Priory's 'parochia'. Events include Norman Open Churches Day on Saturday 21 June, when Yarpole, Eye, Orleton, Monkland, Ford, Hatfield, Pudleston, Bockleton, Leysters and Middleton-on-the-Hill will welcome visitors 10 am – 4 pm. To accompany the day Rob Walker has produced a new illustrated booklet, *The Normans in and around Leominster*, which features the open churches. There will also be a Priory 900 Team Celebration Service on Sunday 29 June at 10 am, followed by a 'Bring and Share' Picnic in the Priory grounds.

Priory 900 is supported by The National Lottery Heritage Fund, UK Shared Prosperity Fund, The Elmley Foundation, The Harley Charity, The Rowlands Trust, and The William A Cadbury Trust. Find out more about the festival events at www.prioryarts.org.uk






